

It is your responsibilty to make sure your address is reflective and visible from from the roadway. If your mailbox is not in front of your residence, you should have at least 4" high reflective numbers on your house or at the driveway. If you do not receive mail at your residence, you still need to have your E-911 address on your house or at your driveway using at least 4" high numbers. The reflective numbers kits can be found at stores, such as Lowe's Home Improvement, Home Depot and other hardware stores.

All county addresses are assigned by the Addressing/ GIS Manager; not by the Post Office

E-911 Address
Guidelines



The Addressing/GIS Department is here to assist in the safety, health and well-being of all Granville County citizens. We want to ensure the ability of emergency response teams to quickly locate your residence and/or property. If an address is not properly marked and visible, there may be a delay in emergency services.



Nice, but not reflective. By adding at least 4" reflective numbers, the mailbox can still remain attractive and be easy to locate.





Both of these are very attractive, but not reflective. The large numbers are great, but adding reflective numbers would help emergency response teams quickly locate your residence. Also, the flowers may eventually grow to cover up the numbers. Make sure all vegetation is clear from the numbers.





Nice, but numbers can only be seen from the front of the mailbox. The numbers should be on both sides and be reflective.

These are ideal for all situations. Large, reflective numbers that are at least 4" high and can be seen from both directions. These can be used with a mailbox or for someone who does not have a mailbox at their house.
