The Granville County Juvenile Crime Prevention Council (JCPC) has studied the risk factors and needs of Juvenile Court involved youth in this county and hereby publishes this Request for Proposals. The JCPC anticipates funds from the NC Department of Public Safety (DPS) in the amount stated above to fund the program types specified below. Such programs will serve delinquent and at-risk youth for the State fiscal year 2020-2021 beginning on, or after, July 1, 2020. The use of these funds in this county requires a local match in the amount specified above. For fiscal year 2020-2021, programs submitting proposals should consider the new "Raise the Age Law" effective 12/01/2019 that increased the age of juveniles to include 16-17 year old youth.

**Based on identified needed programs the JCPC will consider proposals for the following needed program types:**

**Proposed program services should target the following concerns as reported in the Risk and Needs Factors for delinquency or repeat delinquency. Information below represents youth assessed from July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2019:**

- 19% of youth at intake in Granville presented with a runaway history
- 78% of youth at intake in Granville presented with moderate to serious school behavior problems
- 65% of youth at intake presented with negative peer interactions, of which 13% reported to gang involved
- 21% of youth at intake in Granville were functioning below grade level
- 46% of youth at intake in Granville had some substance abuse in last 12 months
- 32% of youth at intake in Granville reported to have history of victimization
- 74% of youth at intake in Granville presented with MH needs
- 19% of youth at intake in Granville were living in temporary residential setting
- 50% of youth at intake in Granville presented with conflict in the home
- 50% of youth at intake in Granville presented with marginal parental supervision
- 50% of youth at intake in Granville presented with family that had previous or current involvement with legal system

**Applicants are being sought that are able to address the legislatively mandated items below**

1. Program services compatible with research that is shown to be effective with juvenile offenders.
2. Program services are outcome-based.
3. The program has an evaluation component.
4. Program services detect gang participation and divert individuals
