Requirements for Temporary Electric Power:

- The service wiring and equipment shall be installed, the service wiring terminated, and service equipment covers installed.
- The portions of the electrical system that are to be energized shall be complete and physical protected.
- The grounding electrode system shall be complete.
- The grounding and grounded conductors shall be terminated in the service equipment.
- All receptacles with a minimum of one shall be GFCI protected.
- The applicable requirements of the North Carolina Electrical Code apply.
- The applicant shall maintain the energized electrical system or that portion of the building containing the energized electrical system in a secured and locked manner or under constant supervision to exclude unauthorized personnel.
- The applicant shall alert personnel working in the vicinity of the energized electrical system to its presence.

I/we hereby agree to complete this electrical installation in accordance with all applicable laws within the allotted time frame or else apply for the additional time. I/we will call the Inspector for the required final inspection and approval, and understand that if the final inspection is not made within the allotted time, POWER COMPANY will be notified to disconnect the source of power. The applicant making the request for temporary service hereby assumes all liability for any damage, which may occur due to the electric current being connected.

Also, we the undersigned hereby acknowledge that it is unlawful to occupy or to permit the occupancy of any building for which a Certificate of Occupancy has not been issued, and that a Certificate of Occupancy cannot be issued until all applicable trades (Building, Electrical, Plumbing and Mechanical) have been conducted and approved their respective final inspections. Furthermore, we understand that the North Carolina State Building Code defines "occupied" as follows: As applied to a building, shall be construed as though followed by the words "on intended, arranged or designed to be occupied," and that the presence of furniture, stock, etc. is therefore construed by the Inspection Department as occupancy.

We understand that any furniture, stock, etc. moved into the building prior to issuance of a Certificate of Occupancy (without prior written approval from the Inspection Department) will result in a denial of further requested inspections and notification to POWER COMPANY to disconnect the source of power until such time that the furniture, stock, etc. is removed from the building.
