
CREATE A DESKTOP SHORTCUT

- 1. Open Chrome.
- 2. Navigate to the desired website and click the three-dot icon in the top-right corner of your browser window.
- 3. Go to More tools > Create shortcut.
- 4. Name your shortcut and click Create.



SET YOUR HOMEPAGE AND STARTUP PAGE


You can customize Google Chrome to open any page for the homepage or startup page. These two pages aren't the same unless you set them to be.

- Your startup page is the one that shows when you first launch Chrome on your device.
- Your homepage is the one you go to when you click Home Ω .

Choose your Homepage


You can control what page appears when you click Home \triangle .

1. Open Chrome and click the three-dot icon in the top-right corner of your browser window.



- 2. Go to Settings.
- 3. Under "Appearance," turn on **Show Home Button**.
- 4. Below "Show Home Button," choose to use the **New Tab Page** or type a webpage URL to use a custom page.


5. The Home button will appear to the left of your address bar.



Open a Specific Set of Pages

You can tell Chrome to open to any webpage.

1. Open Chrome and click the three-dot icon in the top-right corner of your browser window.



- 2. Go to Settings.
- 3. Under "On startup," select **Open a specific page or set of pages**.
 - Click Add a new page. Enter the web address and click Add;
 or
 - Click **Use current pages** (to set all open webpages as your startup set of pages).
- 4. To update your pages, to the right of a page, click More **Edit** or **Delete**.
